THE MAX FORMAN SENIOR RESEARCH PRIZE

INTRODUCTION

This prize, derived from the Max Forman Research Fund, recognizes excellence in medical research with the aim of promoting and encouraging its pursuit in the Dalhousie Medical School.

The annual award is open to all senior investigators in the Faculty of Medicine.

APPLICATION

Nominations for the award should be made by a member of the Faculty of Medicine at Dalhousie University and must be supported by a letter from the Dept. Head. The nominator's letter should thoroughly document the candidate's contribution to research. A brief CV (*2 pages maximum*) and up to five of the candidate's publications may be appended to support the nomination. Nominations will be reviewed by the Foundation's Scientific Advisory Committee. Only nominations recognizing work performed at Dalhousie will be considered. If in the view of the committee, no suitable nomination is received, no award will be made.

TERMS AND VALUE OF AWARD

Investigators will be eligible to receive only one award. The prize recipient will receive a cash prize of \$10,000. Max Forman Research Prize recipients are required to present their work at a date and place to be determined.

HISTORY

The Max Forman Research Prize was originally established by Mrs. Sophie Forman in memory of her late husband, Max Forman. A member of the local business community, Mr. Forman was a respected businessman and philanthropist in the community. The Forman Award now honours the memory of both Mr. & Mrs. Forman and pays tribute to their kind and generous support for medical research.
