

**Emergency and Critical Care Award
in Emergency Medicine Innovation**

Call for Applications

Introduction:

The Emergency and Critical Care Ultrasound (ECCU) Award in Emergency Medicine Innovation has been established by Drs. David Lewis and Paul Atkinson to encourage, recognize and inspire innovation in research, emergency medical education and academic initiatives for all aspects related to Emergency Medicine and Critical Care, with a preference to innovations that promote the use of Point of Care Ultrasound (PoCUS). There will be a minimum of one award valued at a maximum of \$1,250.

Eligible Applicants:

The applicant must be a Dalhousie Medicine New Brunswick Medical Student, a Dalhousie Medicine Resident based in New Brunswick, or other New Brunswick based health care professional working with a Dalhousie Faculty member, e.g., nurse researcher.

Awarding Body:

The Office of the Associate Dean, Dalhousie Medicine New Brunswick; with the Saint John Regional Hospital Emergency Medicine Academic Council of Emergency Medicine.

Application Package:

Applicants may submit a 1,000-word summary describing either a recently completed or proposed project, outlining their background, rationale, methods, (results and conclusion if available) and impact. References should be provided.

Supplementary material describing or linking to Educational modules, research abstracts or papers should be included if available.

Review Criteria

Projects will be scored independently by a review panel, according to quality of the project, as well as the potential impact on Emergency Medicine and Point of Care Ultrasound practice, research or education in New Brunswick.

Requirement of Successful Recipient:

The successful recipient(s) be required to submit a progress/final report to the Associate Dean Dalhousie Medicine New Brunswick and the Executive Director, Dalhousie Medical Research Foundation within 12 months of the receipt of the award.
